Every November hundreds of federal officials, state agency staff and contractors gather for the annual government-payments conference, EBT—the Next Generation, sponsored by the eGovernment Payments Council

eGPC Mission

The mission of the eGovernment Payments Council is to provide a single organization representing the government payments community.

The purpose of the Council is to promulgate rules and best practices and advocate effectively for policy and business practices in support of migrating paper-based government payments to electronic debit card technology.

Supporting the Council

The Council is supported entirely by member dues. The dues structure includes six categories of membership.

Founder

The Founder category includes all of the rights and privileges of membership, plus the membership in the Quest® Rules Forum. This allows Founders the ability to work directly with states on the operating rules for the national EBT network. *Annual dues: \$7,000.*

Charter

Charter members include companies with annual revenues in excess of \$500,000. It also includes access to the Quest Rules Forum. *Annual dues: \$6,000.*

Trustee

Trustee members are companies who do not wish to be involved with the Quest rules. *Annual Dues: \$5,000.*

Pioneer

Pioneer members are individual state agencies. *Annual dues: \$3,600.*

Service

Service members are smaller technology companies with annual revenues not exceeding \$500,000. *Annual dues: \$2,000.*

Advisory

Advisory members are non-profits or government agencies that do not operate EBT systems but represent stakeholders or advise state agencies. *Annual dues: \$200.*
